Sister M. Sixta, a sister to Sister M. Terentia, M.S.C. came to the United States as novice in 1927. After her novitiate Sister was assigned to help with the various chores of domestic work. The longest part of her religious life Sister spent serving the sick, the convalescent, or the aged in Wedron, Wellsburg, and Limeport. Although not well herself, she yet never shirked work. She faithfully performed all duties to the very end.

Five months before Sister died, she was hospitalized because of an active Tuberculosis. She responded well to the care and treatments given her and was eagerly awaiting to be discharged and come back to the Motherhouse. However, things turned for the worst. Sister suffered a stroke of her right side, which eventually proved to be fatal.

Sister M. Sixta was a deeply prayerful soul. Even at work she prayed incessantly. During her last illness the rosary was her greatest consolation and her constant companion. She was also most appreciative of every service rendered her, especially during her last illness. Sister was well prepared to meet her God, having been strengthened during the latter part of her illness by the reception of the Sacrament of the Anointing. When He called, she passed away quietly. May she now enjoy eternal peace and rest.

The Requiem Mass for our departed Sister will be celebrated on Tuesday, August 4, at 4:30 P.M. and immediately after will be the funeral in our Convent cemetery.
