Sister M. Willigis came to America as a Postulant in 1923. Much of her Religious life was spent in the teaching apostolate in many of our schools. This morning Sister attended Holy Mass and received Holy Communion. After breakfast she helped with the dishes as usual, and then on the way to Chapel for meditation she stopped by the laundry to say a friendly greeting to the lay woman who works there. It was in chapel, before the Blessed Sacrament that she died, quietly and peacefully as she had lived.
