Sister Avila Marie was diagnosed just eight months ago as having cancer of the brain. Surgery removed much of the tumor. Initially she responded well to radiation and chemotherapy. However, the cancer continued to spread so all treatment was discontinued. Sister offered her many months of suffering for the blessing of God upon the ministry of evangelization. She was a very prayerful, contemplative person, faithful to daily centering prayer. The fruits of her prayer were so evident in her peaceful attitude, her quiet and pleasant ways throughout her illness. Sister will now know the fruit of her favorite breath prayer — "Abide in Me."

On Wednesday at 11:00 a.m., we shall celebrate the Mass of the Resurrection for sister. Then sister will be buried in our convent cemetery. We are grateful to Sister Avila Marie for the many years she was gift to us.
