She was engaged in teaching Kindergarten in Athens and Northampton, and served as infirmarian in the University of Dayton, in Ohio, and as homemaker in Beacon, Wellsburg, Wedron, Brooklyn, and Coopersburg. in 1974, Sister retired and spent three years in St. Michael Convent and four years in Villa St. Elizabeth.

Sister Michael was most kind and considerate in word and action, always grateful for any service given to her and ever willing to lend a helping hand to another. Her whole personality was characterized by her love of beauty and her talent for art. Skilled in painting and arts and crafts, Sister delighted in providing little surprises for her fellow Sisters on feastdays.
