Theresa Mary and Dolores Ann were born twins just shy of Pearl Harbor Day in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Seven and a half years later their twin brothers, Paul and Michael, were born.

Because of God's great personal love for me, God gave me, Sr. Theresa Molchanow: parents and faith-filled grandparents of East-European origin who loved me; a Catholic School Education; and an adventurous, persevering spirit. As a twin I learned early in life that the world was bigger than I.

It was the word "missionary," along with information about a high school for girls [St. Michael's] who may be interested in becoming Missionary Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, in an ad printed in *The Sunday Visitor* Catholic newspaper, which became, for me, God's clear invitation into the rest of my life. I became a Missionary Sister of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus with my first profession of the evangelical vows of consecrated obedience, chastity and poverty in 1961.

I reside now at Saint Michael Convent in Reading, Pennsylvania with several other retired M.S.C. Sisters. Presently, I am grateful to be able to live with my twin sister who also is a Missionary Sister of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. My present ministry is one of prayer for the world and others, of doing what I can to care for the earth, our common home, of simple service within community, and of keeping in touch with family and with those whom I have known.



Even though my life as a Missionary Sister of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus these past 60+ years has sent me to live and serve in the U.S.A., Papua New Guinea, Italy and Mexico, the list of what I may have accomplished is not as important to me as is the "heart" of each of these missions.
