Lay Missionaries Welcome New Member and Renew Commitments

The Missionary Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart and the Lay Missionaries of the Sacred Heart gathered for their yearly retreat and commitment ceremony at St. Michael Convent on June 3, 2023. Retreat facilitator Fr. Kevin Nadolski, OSFS helped the Sisters and Associates contemplate the topic of synodality, especially in their journeying together as the People of God, and they also welcomed their newest member Patricia Hansbury during the closing Mass. Some take-aways from the day include the following:

 To have a synodal heart means that we are called to be more relational and less institutional.

Synodality in the Church means that we have a heart which



recognizes the gifts and equality of every person and every person matters.

• Through every challenge, we must dialogue with one another. Successful dialogue demands that we join with a sincere heart, without being overly attached to our own beliefs — nondefensively, and without aggressiveness, passive aggressiveness or sarcasm. In order to interact and to live in the Heart of Christ, we should get in touch with our original impulse of grace — that moment when we knew the love of God for the first time. Identifying that moment of

grace, which is the Holy Spirit itself, will inspire us, awaken us, and move us. Our shared experiences of God's comtinued on page 5

MSC Sisters Join Vietnamese Community in Celebration

On Sunday, August 20, 2023, the Missionary Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart welcomed Father Pham and his Vietnamese community from St. Paul's Parish in Reading, PA to St. Michael Convent to celebrate the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Mother into heaven. This celebration, which hadn't graced our convent since prior to the pandemic, truly was a joyful and inspirational observance of our multicultural Church.

The day began with a procession, accompanied by the sound of a beating drum, into our beautiful Chapel which had

been decorated the day before. At the end of the procession came a dragon float and on top of it was a statue of the Blessed Mother surrounded by flowers. Women accompanied the float dressed in long gowns and holding a bouquet of roses in each hand. The



procession ended when the statue of Mary was carried into Chapel and placed near the side altar in a place of honor so all could see her.

Mass began with the music of a beautiful choir and the offertory included women who processed to the front of chapel to reverently present their flowers and praise with a liturgical dance. After this they presented the gifts of bread and wine to Father and our chapel was filled with the beautiful voices of the Vietnamese people.

After Mass we continued the celebration with a picnic on our grounds. Father Pham

thanked us for sharing with the Vietnamese community and made sure we had plenty of Vietnamese food to enjoy. We MSC Sisters enjoyed the privilege of celebrating the Liturgy in Vietnamese and we look forward to doing so again. $\$

MEMORIAM

Sister M. Josanne Huber, MSC

1931 - 2023

On the morning of September 7th one of our Sisters noticed a change in Sister Josanne's breathing. Knowing that Sister Josanne cherished the Divine Mercy Chaplet, the attending Sister accessed the Divine Mercy Chaplet on her phone and placed it close to Sister Josanne's ear. Upon hearing the prayer, Sister Josanne opened her eyes wide, then closed them, and breathed her last. Throughout her life, Sister Josanne had a great devotion to the Blessed Mother and the rosary and so it seems appropriate that she died on the eve of the feast of Mary's Nativity.



Sister Josanne entered our congregation at the age of twentyfour after having worked as a nurse and nursing supervisor in our Sacred Heart Hospital in Allentown, PA. Some of our Sisters were under her supervision when they were nursing students. She was known for her caring and compassionate presence and for her devotion to the sick and to the concerns of their family members. Her ministry in various hospitals as a nurse included Sacred Heart Hospital, in Norristown, PA, St. Mary's Hospital in Athens, GA, and Good Samaritan Hospital, in Pottsville, PA. Her loving, compassionate, and professional care was extended to her mother as Sister Josanne nursed her for nine years until her mother's death.

Sister Josanne then embraced the pastoral care of the patients in these hospitals and in parish situations. For Sister Josanne, God was a God of love and infinite mercy. This is what she

conveyed to all who came into her life. Whether she was nursing the sick or ministering to them in Pastoral Care, Sister Josanne imparted a constant care and love for each person.

Sister Josanne had a great devotion to the Blessed Mother and the Rosary. As an active member of the Legion of Mary, she regularly attended and led their devotions. She often attended parish novenas, special Masses, feast days, etc. When her relatives and our Sisters came to visit her in the hospital or her recent residence at St. Joseph Villa, they often

prayed the rosary with and for her.

In the midst of her busy schedule as nurse and pastoral minister, Sr. Josanne still found time to be in faithful and thoughtful correspondence with many people, never missing birthdays, feast days, anniversaries and other special occasions of our Sisters, her family, and associates. She also loved to bake and was often baking at midnight since she was so busy during the day. What a joy for her fellow Sisters as they woke up to the special, wonderful aroma.

Sister Josanne was a nurse, a pastoral minister, an imitator of Mary, our Mother, and lover of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. She is now our intercessor before the throne of God. Sister Josanne often shared the following prayer of blessing on the hospital intercom after the Morning Prayer: "God bless and have a peaceful day." 1


Mission Immersion Trips Continue

Sharing Experiences: World Youth Day 2023

World Youth Day 2023 held from August 1-6 in Lisbon, Portugal was my first-time taking part in this momentous event and I felt God's presence in every place and in every person to whom I said, "hello!"

My experience was humbling because I was surrounded by young people who all were striving for the same thing -the meaning of life! I felt united with young people from all over the world, which expanded my thoughts about belonging to the Catholic Church. The group I went with from Namibia, celebrated Mass together and reflected on the readings each day in small communities.

This World Youth Day was an immense experience of healing and grace. I will never forget the Saturday vigil of adoration preceding the closing Mass by his Holiness Pope Francis. 15th Anniversary of Korea's "Sacred Heart **Hope Shelter**"

In Korea, "migrant women" generally means "women who left their home countries, married a Korean man and established

themselves in Korea". As Korea's economy has grown rapidly, specific problems have emerged: low birth rates and an aging population, a population declining and



aging in rural areas. International marriage soon emerged as a solution to rural problems, and since the early 2000s. international marriages between rural bachelors and Southeast Asian women have increased rapidly.

However, as the Korean society has long had a strong sense of "unitary nation" (danil minjok), the mindset and institutional readiness to accept and respect immigrants as neighbors and colleagues have been lacking. In particular, migrant women face double discrimination, as both "migrants" and "women". Although they were married, they were not respected as equally, and were often exposed to discrimination, restrictions, and violent situations at various levels.

For that reason, in May 2008, MSC Sisters opened the Sacred Heart Hope Center, a shelter for migrant women and their families in Ulsan and celebrated its 15th anniversary in May of this year. In this center, our Sisters are helping migrant women recover and heal their bodies and minds by providing welfare services such as lodging, psychological counseling, legal support, child rearing, and medical services, as well as psychological and emotional programs.

Despite the prejudice and discrimination against strangers and poor working conditions, these women have been living without getting frustrated among countless trials and sufferings while raising children alone. Seeing their courage and dedication in living their own lives, we feel respect. We, too, will be reminded of our mission. Like the pierced Sacred Heart of Jesus, we thank God for calling us to this precious apostolate in which we can accompany the people whose hearts are pierced and suffering, that their hearts may be filled with compassion and hope. ₽

the school and the parish. We Sisters are so very thankful and blessed to be present among such a vibrant community of faith.



that reigned during the adoration hour. After what seemed like an eternity, the Holy Father spoke softly the following words: "May young people's evangelization be active and missionary, for this is how they will recognize and witness the presence of the living Christ. Sit in front of his Real Presence, and allow God to love you. Don't say anything, just let him love you." I don't know what I had wanted to hear, but his short, simple words were more powerful than anything I had heard before.

Another remarkable and breathtaking experience was the Chapel of Bones, a church built of bones by Franciscan Friars in the 17th century. Near the entrance, the mission is immediately expressed as a symbol of transience: WE BONES, ARE HERE, WAITING FOR YOURS...a gentle reminder that we are created from dust, and to dust we shall return.



I discovered that although a pilgrimage is communal, it is deeply personal and private even in the midst of the many outward activities. I felt transformed in my faith. This is a grace that I will forever cherish. So much depends on our openness to the Holy Spirit.

A special thanks to my Archbishop Liborius N. Nashenda, of the Archdiocese of Windhoek, for making it possible and indeed to my Province Leader, Sr. Veronika lita MSC, for providing such an amazing opportunity for me to grow spiritually, to learn and to witness such beauty beyond imagination. Having been granted an opportunity to represent the Namibian Province as an MSC Sister at this spectacular event will always leave me humbled. Unworthy as I am, I felt the gentle touch of Our Lady as I presented before her the intentions of my Province, family members, relatives, benefactors of the congregation at large, those of holy mother church, and indeed of the entire world. I feel so blessed to have had this experience of a lifetime. \$\P\$
